Maria Montessori

Dr. Maria Montessori, born in 1870, was the first woman in Italy to receive a medical degree. She worked in the fields of psychiatry, education and Anthropology, never publishing a theory until she had observed it, with children of all classes and in many countries, for years.

She believed that each child is born with a unique potential to be revealed, rather than as a "blank slate" waiting to be written upon. Her main contributions to the work of those of us raising and educating children are in these areas: (1) Learning to prepare the most natural and life supporting environment for the child, (2) Observing the child living freely in this environment, and (3) Continually adapting the environment in order that he may fulfill his greatest potential, physically, mentally, emotionally, spiritually.

Today Montessori teacher training centers and schools exist on all continents. The Montessori Method is dynamic in that observation and meeting the needs of each child is continual and specific. The discoveries of Maria Montessori are valuable for anyone living and working with children in any situation. There have been Montessori birth attendants and Assistants to Infancy in Europe since 1947. There are Montessori classes for children up to age eighteen within public and private schools. Many parents are using Dr. Montessori's discoveries to raise their children at home.
